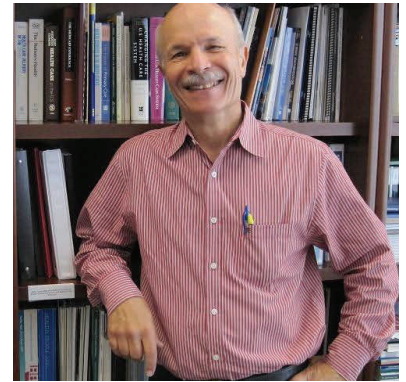


Sunday, Oct. 28 (179.1): “Celebrating the Life and Legacy of Rick Brown”
